Asia Pacific Area NDERF Fund & IP's Discretionary Fund Supported Relief Projects for Floods in Phayao & Chiangrai

(A Report by SMIT District, Southeast Region)

A flash flood occurred on 22 August 2024 at 2:00am, inundating buildings, schools and agricultural areas and community learning materials for the villages. In the provinces of Phayao and Chiangrai, the "Ban Pin School" is a school that provides children with more elementary and intermediate school options. Flooding destroyed the YMCA Bangkok (Phayao Branch) housing centre. As a result, the building's ground floor classrooms were completely ruined. Furthermore, due to the water overflow, approximately 20 meters of the fence of school collasped, causing extensive damage to the entrance road of school. At the same time, the village's preschool learning centre, known as "Baan Phraphon," was a children's centre that was badly affected by the flood, causing massive damage to teaching materials in the Montessori system. This centre was under the care and support of the YMCA Bangkok Foundation. Many cabinets and shelves containing instructional materials were damaged.

Similarly, in the housing centre "Rom Pho Thong Village" in Thoeng District, Chiangrai Province, the village roads have been destroyed by landslides and were so badly damaged that it was impossible for vehicles to enter and exit. Food, water and gasoline are all in short supply. Previously, we had to wait for assistance from government agencies and commercial corporations to bring rice and dry food to the villagers via helicopter, which was insufficient to meet their needs.

A Joint Project initiated by Thailand Y's Men's clubs including YMC Bangkok, Chiangmai & Chiangrai together with Chiangrai YMCA offer relief aids and necessarities to the vitctims and help to restore the schools.





Asia Pacific Area received an appeal from SMIT District, Southeast Asia Region and approved USD 5,000 from Natural Disaster Emergency Relief Fund to fund this Joint Relief Flood Project. The fund were used to set up the YMCA Relief Centre and help the affected schools below:

Ban Pin School, Phayao
Ban Phra Phon Centre, Phayao
Rom Pho Thong Village in Chiangrai
YMCA Relief Centre, Chiangrai
Cleaning and repair expenses for
Chiangrai

Mr. Thamanoon Thiwathip, Club President of Y's Men's Club of Chiangrai and volunteers delivered supplies to assist fellow residents in Theong District, Chiang Rai who have been affected by the severe floods on August 24, 2024.

DG Steve Kwok from SMIT District personally went to Chiangrai to give moral support and met with CP Thamanoon Thiwathip and his members to discuss project planning, voluntary support, fund planning and many-related flood relief suggestions inside the compound of YMCA Day Care Centre.

Good job was done by Chiangrai Club and Bangkok Club, as well as YMCA Chiangrai and YMCA Bangkok (Phayao Branch).



I would like to provide the second article of EMC as part of the IHQ campaign, which is a 100-day membership drive. It goes as follows:

To encourage potential people to join and retain existing members of Y's Men's Club, it's important to communicate both the benefits of membership and create a sense of belonging and shared purpose. Here's a strategic approach for both the club's extension membership and conservation:

A. EMPHASIZE THE VALUE AND IMPACT

Show prospective members how networking and personal development may benefit them by joining the club and how it can improve the community as well as their own lives.

B. CREATE A WELCOMING AND INCLUSIVE ATMOSPHERE

When people feel like they belong, they are more likely to join. Demonstrate that your club is a friendly environment where each person is respected. Make sure the message makes clear that new members are welcome to participate in meetings, events, and volunteer opportunities and that people from all backgrounds are welcome.

C. OFFER INCENTIVES FOR JOINING

Everyone loves privilege! You could offer the information that has been given in the IHQ 2024 campaign. Create a program that recognizes new members for their early contributions.

D. LEVERAGE TESTIMONIALS AND SUCCESS STORIES

Tell members' tales to draw in new ones. Hearing positive feedback from happy members about their experiences can inspire others to take part in sharing accomplishments. Share project highlights, testimonials, and the advantages of participating through social media, newsletters, and your website.

E. USE A PERSONAL INVITATION APPROACH

An invitation from an existing member is the most efficient way to invite someone. Existing members are encouraged to extend invitations to friends, colleagues, or relatives. Envoy programs should be made available so that current members can invite friends to club events.

SEPTEMBER EMPHASIS - EMC

MEMBERSHIP CONSERVATION

A. CREATE A STRONG SENSE OF COMMUNITY

Members stay when they feel a sense of belonging. Foster camaraderie through regular social events such as picnics, parties at member's homes, or even virtual events to strengthen bonds among members. Create a Pair of long-term members with newer members to build relationships and help them integrate into the club more effectively.

B. RECOGNIZE AND REWARD CONTRIBUTIONS

Recognizing members is necessary for conservation. Give awards as a way to express gratitude and recognition. Members are made to feel more significant and responsible to the group when they are assigned to committees or projects based on their interests and skill sets. Give members a chance to be recognized for their contributions by showcasing them in newsletters or social media posts.

C. CONSISTENT COMMUNICATION AND ENGAGEMENT

Encourage participation and enthusiasm among members by providing frequent updates on social media, newsletters, and other platforms. To give members the impression that they are actively involved in forming the club, ask them for ideas for new initiatives or events.

D. FLEXIBLE INVOLVEMENT

Offering flexibility in the form of various involvement levels and digital possibilities is vital because people lead busy lives.

E. FOSTER A CLEAR SENSE OF PURPOSE

Joining Y's Men's Club allows one to support a greater cause. Reiterate the mission and make sure your members always feel like they are having an impact.

F. OFFER CONTINUING EDUCATION OR GROWTH

Ensure that long-term members still perceive the benefits of their membership in terms of developing their leadership and skill sets.

G. SHOW GRATITUDE

Never undervalue the impact of expressing gratitude to members for their participation in club events.

On April 3, 2024, a magnitude 7.2 earthquake occurred in Hualien, killing 18 people and injuring 1,155 people across Taiwan. The Hualien area was the most severely affected.

Taiwan Region taken a donation activity for "Hualien earthquake on April 3, 2024 disaster relief donations", there three units donated together: Japan West Region, Osaka Nishi Club and Tokyo-Koto club, total donation money is NT\$548,656.

At the beginning of September we carried out the donation, there are two targets for donation: one is a severely damaged building with 150 households (donation of NT\$250,000), and the other is a food bank that cares for the affected households (donation of NT\$298,656).
