





Y's Men's Club of Young Moratuwa donated musical Instruments for helping form an Eastern Band for the Methodist College, Rawathawaththa in October 2024.



Gathering from Around the World –
2024 Dubai IYC

Dubai is a rapidly developing city that combines towering skyscrapers with a wealth of traditional, historic culture. Due to local policies, I encountered many international migrant workers from South Asia, including India, and the cultural differences left a strong impression on me. Life here moves at a slower pace. Over the past few days, I've tried to blend into the local lifestyle by chatting with vendors at street stalls, though most shopkeepers are unfamiliar with Taiwan. Riding the local metro and buses, I noticed that people here are not deterred by crowded conditions. They will push you in without hesitation, showing little concern for physical contact with strangers.

Regarding food culture, I observed that Indian and American cuisines heavily influence the local palate. When I asked people for recommendations on local dishes, interestingly, none of the ten people I asked suggested any Arabic food, which I found unfortunate.

As a country with a highly developed tourism industry, Dubai seems to have

lost of diverse cultures, and from my experience, it seems that, similar to some of its unique cultural essence. Like the United States, Dubai is a melting pot of most highly developed cities, traditional culture here is not actively promoted.

At this IYC event, participants from various countries presented the issues their countries face and described the programs their clubs have implemented to support their communities. I think Taiwan's Y's Men face a major challenge with a lack of young members. There are few young volunteers, and the organization has low visibility in Taiwan. Due to Taiwan's comprehensive social welfare system, there is less urgency to support disadvantaged groups compared to other countries. Therefore, we might consider adopting a different approach, such as organizing activities that could attract more attention from young people and increase youth involvement.

During this journey, I thoroughly enjoyed making friends from different countries. I found a group of friends who share a love of fun, and after activities, we would head out together from the hotel to explore the city and try local street food. On our first day in Dubai, we ran to the beach, wrestled in the water, and returned to the hotel soaked to attend the evening event. Every night, the first thing we would ask each other was, "Where are we going next?" We would play music from different countries, talk about our interests, jam on the guitar, and play games in our hotel rooms, creating a deep bond over these few days. When it was time to say goodbye, everyone cried. The memories of this IYC event in Dubai are beautiful, and I truly wish we had more time together.


